

Gustav Dahl, MSc in Engineering: The Internet and Privacy in a Connected World



How we communicate and transfer information has changed significantly since the dawn of the Internet age. Most people are familiar with how to share information on the Internet through e.g. e-mail, Facebook etc.. However, what is not clear and transparent are the new dangers and concerns that the technology has engendered.

Amongst other topics, this lecture will present how a number of countries have managed to hijack sensitive information. In specific, we will discuss and review Google's surveillance of Firefox users.

Gustav Dahl will answer such questions as:

- How can your data be transferred to China without your knowledge?
- Are you aware which countries your data traversed?
- Why do privacy matter if you believe that you have nothing to hide?

An introduction to personal data protection on the internet will be presented at the end of the lecture.

All information will be presented in a comprehensible way. Hence, people from all background will have no problems understanding the dilemmas and concerns.

The lecture will be presented by Gustav Dahl who holds a Master of Science in Engineering degree from The Technical University of Denmark.
